CLUB DUES

DUES FOR 2015-16 ARE CURRENTLY DUE and will be collected until JULY 31 at which time membership will be terminated. The fees remain unchanged since the club was founded in 2002, and are extremely reasonable. They are as follow:

New, <u>full membership</u> is \$25 (First year dues include a club T-shirt & AAC dash card) Membership renewal is \$10 per year

New, social membership is \$20 (First year dues include a club T-shirt)

Social membership renewal is \$5 per year

New, junior membership is \$20 (First year dues include a club T-shirt)

Junior membership renewal is \$5 per year

Reinstatement (\$25 full or \$20 Social/Jr.) does not include a T-shirt and other benefits

The first scheduled cruise-in of the year was held on May 31 at the Mifflintown location of Harshbarger's Subs & Malts. As in the past, canned goods and other non-perishable items were collected. We are proud to announce that 89 pounds of food was donated to the Juniata County Food Bank on Tuesday, June 2. An additional \$44.00 was accepted and placed in the club's "Food Bank Fund." That amount, along with what is earned at other fund raising events, will eventually be divided equally among the food banks in Mifflin, Juniata, and Perry Counties. Heartfelt thanks are extended to all Cruizers and friends who attended the cruise-in and made generous contributions of food and/or monetary donations.

CAR SHOWS, CRUISE-INS, AND EVENTS ATTENDED

Saturday, June 6 was the Corvette only show sponsored by the Perry County Corvette Club. The show is held annually in conjunction with Regester Chevrolet's new car show and open house. Even though the morning started off with light rain, approximately 80 Corvettes, 71 registered, filled the lot at Regester's. Eight members of the club were in attendance, having driven four vehicles. Congratulations to Don & Sally Roberts who took a 1st place with their 1967 Coupe ('63 thru '67 C-2 Class) and to Al Coudriet who took home a Dealer's Choice trophy with his 1963 Coupe.



The second annual Summertime Shine Car Show was held at Cooper Field in Duncannon on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 7</u>. It was reported that ten Cruizers' cars and trucks were registered with six winning 1st or 2nd place awards (money, not trophies). Congratulations to all winners.







Saturday, June 13 was heavily scheduled with car show events, several being the Enola Sportsman Car Show, Newton-Wayne Car Show, Reedsville Community Day, and the Suplex Car Show in Newport. Cruizers were "split" as to which event was attended. Some 100 cars and trucks were registered at the Enola Show, but no report or pictures were made available. It was reported that 52 vehicles, nine of which were owned by club members, registered in Newport. No pictures were provided. It was also reported that five Cruizers showed up in the rain to display their cars at Reedsville and were treated to ice cream/milkshakes. No trophies were awarded. Again, no pictures were submitted. Five Cruizers' vehicles were registered at Newton-Wayne, with Tim Drake taking a 1st and Dealer's Choice while Todd & Mindy Fisher took 2nd place, along with Ken Fleming, in their respective categories.
