CLUB DUES REMAIN THE SAME

Dues for the 2017-18 year are <u>currently being accepted</u> and will continue to be accepted until the end of 2018. At that point, dues will be collected for the entire 2019 year. Note this is a "transition" to a January 1 - December 31 calendar year, to correspond with Brent's end of year fiscal reporting. Please note that the fees remain unchanged since the club was founded in 2002, and are extremely reasonable: so there is no reason not to join or renew. The costs are as follow:

New, <u>full membership</u> is \$25 (First year dues include a club T-shirt & AAC dash card) Membership renewal is \$10 per year

New, <u>social</u> member, i.e., spouse or no car, is \$20 (First year dues include a club T-shirt) Social membership renewal is \$5 per year

New, junior membership is \$20 (First year dues include a club T-shirt)

Junior membership renewal is \$5 per year

Reinstatement (\$25 full or \$20 Social/Jr.) does not include a T-shirt and other benefits

Payment of dues will be accepted at the monthly meetings, and at most of the cruise-ins and car shows, or they may be mailed directly to the club Treasurer Brent Miller at his home address – 117 North 3rd Street, Mifflintown, PA. 17059.
